

### INVENTOR GUESS WHO

Follow the directions in the Unit Study to create your Guess Who Game Board.

Print out two copies of the following pages so that each player can have their own set of cards.

#### How to Play:

- 1. Players determine who goes first by playing one round of rock, paper, scissors.
- 2. Player One will use the information on their Inventor Cards to ask a yes or no question to Player Two, in order to determine Player Two's Mystery Inventor.
- 3. Example questions are: Is your inventor a man? Is your inventor a woman? Was your inventor alive in the 1900s? Did your inventor create something you'd still use today?
- 4. As both players go back-and-forth answering questions, they will use deductive reasoning to remove cards that do not fit the description of their opponent's Mystery Inventor until they can guess who it is.
- 5. The first player to guess correctly wins!

Invented dynamite in 1867.





Invented photography in 1839.




**Ada Lovelace**

**Alexander Miles** 


Invented the automatic elevator doors in 1887.






